IN DETACHED HOUSES, JUDGING BY
THE NEW CARS - 4x4s & JAGUARS,

THE SEMI-DETACHED HOUSES IF REDUCED
BY £140, MULTIPLY BY 210,000 HOUSES
WORKS OUT AT £29,400,000

IF THE SAME HOUSES HAD RISEN BY
£140 BRINGING THEM UP TO £885 PER
YEAR, THE RATES REVENUE WOULD HAVE
HAD £58,800,000 TO BALANCE THE PAYMENTS
MORE EVENLY.
